This vaccine will be offered <u>at school</u> to kids who are **11-12** years old.



The **HBV vaccine** protects against **hepatitis B virus** which causes an infection in the liver. For some people, this infection does not go away. This can lead to:

- Liver damage
- Liver cancer
- Death

3 reasons to get the HBV vaccine at school

It works! The HBV vaccine is very good at preventing infections that could make your child very sick and lead to serious health outcomes.

It's safe! Canada has a very good system to ensure vaccines are safe. It is much safer for your child to get the HBV vaccine than to get infected.

It's easy! A nurse will give your child the vaccine at school if you sign and return the consent forms. You won't have to take them to get the vaccine yourself.

HPV-9 Vaccine for Grade 6 Students

This vaccine will be offered <u>at school</u> to kids who are **11-12** years old.



The **HPV-9 vaccine** protects against 9 common strains of **human papillomavirus** (**HPV**) which is a virus that can cause:

- Head and neck cancer
- Cervical and vaginal cancers
- Anal cancer
- Penile cancer
- Genital warts

3 reasons to get the HPV vaccine at school

It works! HPV is very common and the HPV vaccine is very good at preventing infections that could cause cancer and other serious health outcomes.

It's safe! Canada has a very good system to ensure vaccines are safe. It is much safer for your child to get the HPV vaccine than to get infected.

It's easy! A nurse will give your child the vaccine at school if you sign and return the consent forms. You won't have to take them to get the vaccine yourself.

dTap Vaccine for Grade 9 Students

- **Diphtheria:** a nose and throat infection
- **Tetanus:** an infection of the nervous system
- **Pertussis:** a lung and airway infection
